Past Tense Endings

PRESENTATION

The regular past tense -ed ending can be pronounced as a syllable or a sound.

1. Pronounce the -ed ending as a new syllable (/əd/ or /ɪd/) when the base verb ends in /t/ or /d/.

land — It landed at 8:00 P.M.

2. Pronounce the -ed ending as /t/ or /d/ when the base verb ends in other sounds.

a. Use /t/ when the base verb ends in a voiceless sound (/p, k, θ , f, s, f, tf/). kiss — He "kisst" (kissed) his mother.

b. Use $\frac{d}{d}$ when the base verb ends in a vowel or voiced sound ($\frac{d}{d}$, \frac{d} open — I "opend" (opened) the door.
